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Steven K. Green, renowned for his scholarship on the separation of church and state, charts the career of the concept and helps us understand how it has fallen into disfavor with many Americans. In 1802, President Thomas Jefferson distilled a leading idea in the early American republic and wrote of a wall of separation between church and state. That metaphor has come down from Jefferson to twenty-first-century Americans through a long history of jurisprudence, political contestation, and cultural influence. This book traces the development of the concept of separation of church and state and the Supreme Court's application of it in the law. Green finds that conservative criticisms of a separation of church and state overlook the strong historical and jurisprudential pedigree of the idea, yet arguing with liberal advocates of the doctrine, he notes that the idea remains fundamentally vague and thus open to loose interpretation in the courts. As such, the history of a wall of separation is more a variable index of American attitudes toward the forces of religion and state. Indeed, Green argues that the Supreme Court's use of the wall metaphor has never been essential to its rulings. The

contemporary battle over the idea of a wall of separation has thus been a distraction from the real jurisprudential issues animating the contemporary courts

hamburger argues that separation of church and state has no historical foundation in the first amendment and shows that eighteenth century americans almost never invoked this principle although jefferson and others retrospectively claimed a first amendment basis for separation it became part of american constitutional law only much later

this tour of the american church state issue revisits past controversies and personalities in the hope of enlightening present day debates examining an issue that has been a matter of controversy since the founding of the united states separation of church and state offers a chronological survey that helps put the ongoing debate in broad historical context the book briefly traces the earliest instances of tension between church and state within the western tradition from the era of constantine to the reformation before moving on to the american experience attention is paid to the colonial debates about the ideal relationship between faith and politics the 18th century trends that culminated in a constitutional settlement and the experiences of various religious groups during the early republic and 19th century finally the book focuses on the post 1940 era during which church state controversies came before the supreme court in the course of the discussion readers will learn about complex legal and theological issues and debates between the great and powerful but also about ordinary americans whose religious scruples led to some of the most important legal cases in u s history

thomas curry argues that discussion and interpretation of the first amendment have reached a point of deep crisis historical scholarship dealing with the background and interpretation of the amendment are at an impasse and judicial interpretation is in a state of disarray here curry provides a new paradigm for the understanding and exploration of religious liberty contending that much of the present confusion can be traced to habits of mind that persist from christendom and inevitably draw government into religious matters the first amendment however was meant to be a departure from the thinking that had preceded it for nearly fifteen hundred years curry traces much of the current difficulty to the largely unexamined assumption on the part of judges and scholars that the amendment created a right the right to free exercise of religion and that the courts are the guardians of that right the first amendment is in fact a limitation on government and a guarantee that the government will not impinge on the religious liberty that citizens already possess by natural right here curry shows that the key to finding more coherence between church state decisions and the historical meaning and purpose of the first amendment lies in embracing this understanding of the amendment as a limitation on government

this provocative book shows how the united states supreme court has used constitutional history in church state cases donald l drakeman describes the ways in which the justices have portrayed the framers actions in a light favoring their own views about how church and state should be separated he then marshals the historical evidence leading to a surprising conclusion about the original

meaning of the first amendment's establishment clause the framers originally intended the establishment clause only as a prohibition against a single national church in showing how conventional interpretations have gone astray he casts light on the close relationship between religion and government in america and brings to life a fascinating parade of church state constitutional controversies from the founding era to the present

although the supreme court has stated that the framers of the constitution erected a wall of separation between church and state history shows that collective political activity in the united states has been and remains an intensely religious enterprise despite seemingly clear agreement on the principle of separation what that principle entails in controversies involving not only the activities and demands of religious groups but the court itself has proved contentious professor bradley's book is the most comprehensive analysis of the subject attempted to date it offers a detailed exploration of the historical meaning of the establishment clause of the united states constitution and church state relations from the founding period down to the controversies that are a feature of our modern political life

the establishment clause of the first amendment governs the relationship between the institutions of the church and those of the state the supreme court as arbiter of the constitution has since 1947 sought to determine where the line between the two should be drawn this book shows how and why the court drew the line in particular cases and how and why the lines that were drawn by the court had an impact on the relationship between institutions of government and the church shaping us politics and society using the supreme court's cases as a framework the book shows how the constitutional underpinnings of church state debates shaped the political economic and social debate on the issue and explores broader debates about religion and american society this book maintains that the court cases cannot be understood separately from the context from which they arose and that legal factors are only part of a broader picture for a historical understanding of the court and establishment clause cases

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
